
## **Project Sheet – Growth Takes Time Card**

## **Supplies:**

Stamps & Bundles: Growth Takes Time

Ink: Early Espresso Classic Stampin' Pads

Stampin' Blends:

**Stampin' Write Markers:** 

Watercolor Pencils: Early Espresso, Granny Apple Green, Old Olive

Card Stock: Basic White, Crumb Cake, Early Espresso, Old Olive

**Designer Series Paper:** 

Misc. Paper: Basic White Medium Envelope

**Tools:** Paper Trimmer, Bone Folder, Sponge Dauber, Paper Snips

Embellishments: Linen Thread

Adhesives: Stampin' Seal Adhesive or Multipurpose Liquid Glue, Mini Glue Dot

## **Directions:**

- 1. Cut Crumb Cake card stock 5 ½" x 8 ½" on long side, score at 4 ¼" on long side, fold in half.
- 2. Cut Basic White card stock 5 ¼" x 4". Adhere to inside of card. TIP: If you want to include a stamped image or sentiment on the inside of your card, stamp before adhering.
- 3. Cut Early Espresso card stock 5 ½" x 3 ½". Adhere to center of card front.
- 4. Cut Crumb Cake card stock 5 ½" x 3 ¼" and 5 ½" x 1". You'll also need small scrap of Crumb Cake card stock.
- 5. On largest piece of Crumb Cake card stock, stamp sentiment in Early Espresso ink in upper left corner. Stamp large tree on right side of card stock and small tree just to the left of large tree. TIP: Don't stamp the trees all the way at the bottom of the card stock because we'll be adding a "layer of dirt" to bottom of card stock in a later step.
- 6. Stamp 2 seedlings in Early Espresso ink on scrap of Crumb Cake card stock.
- 7. Color seedlings and trees with Watercolor Pencils in Early Espresso, Granny Apple Green, and Old Olive.
- 8. Cut out seedlings with Paper Snips but do not adhere yet.
- 9. Tear the 1" strip of Crumb Cake card stock in half lengthwise. Using a Sponge Dauber and Early Espresso Ink Pad, apply ink to torn edge.
- 10. Adhere torn edge to bottom of stamped & colored card stock. TIP: Do not put glue at top edge if you want to be able to tuck a seedling into the dirt.
- 11. Adhere seedlings to stamped and colored card stock as shown.
- 12. Adhere layers to center of card front.
- 13. Tie double bow with Linen Thread and adhere to card front as shown with dot of Multipurpose Glue or Mini Glue Dot.
- 14. Stamp envelope as desired.
